Election of officers is to be done at the regular business meeting in April. The installation of officers will take place in May. Remember, even if you keep the same officers, you need to fill out the Installation Report and install them. Secretaries at all levels will enter the installation reports directly into Malta.

Credentials – Don't forget to elect your delegates and alternates for District, Department and National Conventions. Failure to do this means your Auxiliary will not have a vote on matters that need voting. Pay close attention to dates on when this process is done. Information on this process can be found in your Podium book on pages 33-35. Even if you think no one will be attending, please submit your form. Delegates have a one-year term, not just for convention.

The Legislative Conference that was held in Washington, D.C. in early March was very enlightening. I encourage all people to do their due diligence when making decisions on who and how they vote in any election. Don't always believe in what you hear on TV or read in the newspaper or Facebook. Fact check before making decisions. April is Month of the Military Child, a time to recognize and support military families' children. <u>*Decorate with purple, purple camo, and military insignias</u>. Purple indicates support for all branches of the military: Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines, and Coast Guard. Resources include support from the Department of Defense, community organizations, and the VA. *Ideas for celebrating Month of the Military Child: *Highlight military families on a day each week in April. Designate a spirit week and have activities every day such as: Monday: Flag ceremony, Tuesday: wear red, white, and blue, Wednesday: Write a letter to thank a military person, et., or Mon-Service Branch t-shirt, <u>Tuesday</u>-Purple, <u>Wed-</u>Orange for Unity. *When their parents are deployed, their children's milestones such as birthdays, the holidays and graduations are sometimes missed, have a picnic, go to the park, zoo, library, movies, ice cream, fairs, games, etc. *Congratulate and support the children for supporting their parents and let them know that without their support, military parents wouldn't easily handle the important mission of serving their country. *Take the child out to eat, educate the child on the importance of their patents mission. *Do guidance lesson H is for Honor. *Show-n-Tell - Have students in something military related. Examples: memorabilia from an installation or service branch, favorite airplane, book, military character, items or pictures from prior living locations, pictures or anything related to being a military child. *As a service project adopt a deployed family. Find out what a family with a deployed service member needs help with. *Month of the Military Child recognition in their instruction by having students share their military-connection story through the visual arts, creative writing, musical composition, poetry, etc.
