- The deadline is February 14 *Cards can be store-bought or handmade *Individually wrapped candy can be included if it is attached to the card *Include \$1 per card, cash or check *You can include an envelope if you want, but not necessary *If you include an envelope, *do not seal * you are welcome to include your return address in the event the recipient may write back to you. *If you would like a donation receipt mailed to you, make sure to include your name and mailing address somewhere on or in the box, otherwise we will not know where it came from!
- Check with your CVSCO in the area if there are veterans and their families, homeless vets, women vets, who may be in need of supplies, clothing, food, diapers. Offer to have a collection drive for Valentine's Day. Each year at the State Convention, the special recognition of a dedicated Auxiliary member takes place who has serviced the organization for at least 25 consecutive years. It is the Jeannette Frank Continuous Service Award. Jeannette served as Department President in 1965-1966 and as National President in 1980-1981. Her dedication exemplified her dedication to the Veterans, the Auxiliary and the community.

The nomination process that takes place in the final quarter of the Program Year is simple. Any member in good standing may nominate another outstanding Auxiliary member who they feel deserves this recognition. Nominees must have served for a minimum of 25 consecutive years. (NOTE: Past Department Presidents are NOT eligible as they receive a separate Continuous Service Award.)

Nominations for the 2024-2025 Jeannette Frank Continuous Service Award must be postmarked by April 10, 2025.

NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Hello! As I write this, it's mid-January and guess what is right around the corner?? Spring you say? Well, that may be the case in a few months.... BUT, I'm referring to the Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contests (YACPAC to shorten it up)!!Yes, it's that time of year already... and we need to get our butts in gear and get the word out about this scholarship program so the students have enough time to create those fantastic pieces of art! The deadline to turn an entry in is March 31st – so let's get the word out now. Talk about the program at your meetings, post about it on your social media pages, hand out the entry forms, tell your local art teachers about it, tell your friends with high school age kids.

Who's eligible to enter the YACPAC? Students in grades 9-12 enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the U.S.

What kind of art can be submitted? There are TWO contests: a 2-dimensional and a 3-dimensional contest. 2-D art can be on canvas or paper. Watercolor, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, or marker.3-dimensional art can be made from paper, papiermâché, pottery, clay, metal work, and/or fabric.

Are there rules about how big or small the art can be? Yes, for the 2-dimensional contest the artwork should be no smaller than $8" \times 10"$ but no larger than $18" \times 24"$, INCLUDING mat. Do not frame the art (other than a mat). For the 3-dimensional contest the artwork should be no larger than 18-inches in any direction, and no heavier than 5 lbs.

Is an essay required also? Not an "essay" per se, but an explanation of the art is part of the submittal. Students should submit a typed explanation of the patriotism expressed in their art (250 words or less) along with the entry.

What are the deadlines?

<u>March 31st</u> – deadline for the students to have the artwork turned into your Auxiliary <u>April 15th</u> – deadline to have your 1st place winning artwork sent to myself (address below) for State level judging. Students will get the artwork back after our June Convention. The first-place entry will be forwarded on to National to compete against other state entries from around the nation. Exciting!

What can the students win? There are monetary awards at the State level and National level, and your Auxiliary may want to award your top entries as well! Feel free to browse the website page listed above for more info on awards and photos of past entries. Let's get those creative juices flowing WI!
