REMINDER: General orders **MUST** be read and chairmen's bulletins **summarized** at each meeting. Auxiliary chairman, add your own touch to your program and how you can incorporate the programs into your communities.

YEAR-END REPORTS: As the deadline approaches, it is essential to complete and submit them to your District President and prospective chairman before April 15th. Ensure that you send them to the correct address to avoid any delays or missed award opportunities. It is crucial to fill out the reports thoroughly to receive the recognition your auxiliary deserves; without your input, we may not be aware of your accomplishments. Additionally, while you are reporting for this year, continue to track your hours and pass this information to the next chairman for their report next year.

Adhering to this timeline is crucial for ensuring proper processing and enabling new members to access their benefits promptly



*****VOLUNTEERS NEEDED*****

This past weekend I attended a gathering of Churches, Food Banks, Food Pantries, after School Programs and Community Shelters. The need is immediate. I live in the Fox Valley, consisting of several small towns including Appleton. I never imagined that as many as 500 homeless adults are wandering our streets. 30% of the adults are working and living in their cars, the rest are suffering from mental health issues, alcoholism and drugs. Of that total, 300 are school age children. These children get a free bag lunch every day from a food pantry. The school provides the names. Think about how close you are from being in their place. Sr. citizens are fast becoming a large part of this group. Low- income housing is greatly needed in EVERY community.

Every community has this problem. They are all looking for volunteers. Please visit your Village, town and city halls to get the names of places that could use your help. Ask your churches in your area who is looking for volunteers. Please have your auxiliary members get to the places who do have a need for help. Remember to vote on it at your meeting. Wear your uniform with pride, show the world who we are. Compassionate members of the VFWA.

I found out the shelters need blankets, sleeping bags, basic toiletries, non-perishable food, toilet paper- individually wrapped, safe parking, winter boots, socks, children's clothing for all school age kids and for all ages and genders.

Due to a lack of low-income rental facilities, a lot of these people had to move to their cars. It's only getting worse. Fair housing rental rates are in great need.

This is my plea to get us involved in our communities. Please do what you can. As your Outreach Chairman I will be doing my part.

Have a Happy Holiday season. Be committed in the Spirit of Rising to Lift Others.





FEBRUARY 2026 LEGISLATIVE



Your **HEART** is in the right place – you want to support all our veterans, but how? **ADVOCATE, ADVOCATE, ADVOCATE!!**

We need to keep reaching out to our representatives in Congress and in Madison to **HONOR THE CONTRACT** by providing the resources our veterans have earned. This can only be done when policies are modified and laws are codified. **PLEASE** make your **HEART** felt appeal to your legislators through VFW Action Corps **ACTION ALERTS**.

Here's a partial list of legislation that requires our immediate attention:

H.R.740/S.275 *Veterans' ACCESS Act of 2025*: so our veterans receive clear and timely health care through increased efficiency and coordination of VA's community care program.

H.R.4837 *Written Informed Consent Act*: to make sure our veterans are fully aware of the risks and benefits of new, powerful medications for PTSD and other mental health issues; and,

H.R.2623 *Innovative Therapies Centers of Excellence Act of 2025*: to expand access to innovative PTSD treatments to reduce reliance on heavy medication.

H.R.1845 *Transition Assistance Program (TAP) Promotion Act*: to include accredited reps from national, state, and local organizations in TAP classes veterans attend during the first year after leaving service – a critical time for veterans and their families.

S.1032/H.R.2102 *Major Richard Star Act*: to make sure veterans who were medically retired due to combat injuries receive both Department of War retirement pay **and** VA disability compensation.

MEMBERSHIP NEVER ENDS**

Membership really is the life blood of an organization. Without them all the great ideas and programs have nowhere to go.

In 1866, the Union Veterans that fought in the Civil War formed an organization called the Grand Army of the Republic. This organization grew to over 400,000 members advocating for Veterans and also established Memorial Day. However, when the Spanish-American War Veterans attempted to join, they were told no the organization was just for Civil War Veterans. Therefore, in 1956 when the last Union soldier died the organization ceased to exist.

Let's stop the downhill slide and show growth this year in membership. We need to ensure the continuation of the VFW Auxiliary for the next hundred years; our Veterans and their families need us!

The Department is over 100% in paid members, but DON'T stop. Our goal is 7500 in current members, which would be an increase of 79 over last year's total members. For most of the Auxiliaries that just means recruiting or retaining 5 members. A few Auxiliaries would need a dozen members; all doable this spring.

Here are a few tips that may help you with your membership efforts (From MN Membership Letter):

- Create a recruiting / renewal committee
- Place the VFW Auxiliary Membership QR Code on EVERYTHING!
- Use flyers, local media and social media—with the QR Code. Letters to the Editor of your local newspaper are usually free.
- Create a phone tree to activate members.
- Gift membership to qualifying relatives.
- Get your Post roster and contact their spouses and family members who are not yet Auxiliary members. Many VFW members have children and grandchildren age 16 and older who were younger when the VFW member joined your Post.
- Ask your Post Commander to visit their meeting to talk about their Auxiliary and put an application and the QR Code in their hands. Be sure to leave your contact information.

Remember to have Auxiliary and VFW membership QR Codes, applications, and fact sheets at all your Post and Auxiliary events. Include them along with the scholarship information you distribute to your schools and area students. Work with your community organizations to include VFW Auxiliary and VFW information at book fairs, breakfasts, steak fries, vendor markets, and community celebrations. Leave membership information at your local Chamber of Commerce and Veterans Service office. Ask to hand out flyers and QR Codes along parade routes. All you need to do is ask; most are willing to include us.

Check out your Former Member report that is in MALTA under View Members. Reach out to these lost members (in person, if possible) and encourage them to come back onboard. Tell them about all the great work your Auxiliary is doing and the benefits of rejoining. If they do not want to rejoin, ask them why. You can use this information to improve your Auxiliary.

MEMBERSHIP NEVER ENDS! We need to ensure the future of our great organization by consistent, steady growth. Each one of our memberships need to be full, healthy and vibrant.

Notables:



As we celebrate 100 years, that in itself is exciting. WI Veterans Assistance is important to us as well. We help WI Veterans. So far this VFW Auxiliary year \$33,017.67 has been granted to 25 WI Veterans. 20 grants were not approved (due to ineligibility, ineligible expenses, or failure to respond to follow-up questions, and/or request for additional information). Their grants may be used for rent, house payment or car repair, medical bills, groceries and whatever comes up. We still need donations to help our WI Veterans.





YOUTH ENGAGEMENT

Contest Eligibility

- Students do not have to be related to a VFW or VFW Auxiliary member to participate
- Students in grades K-8 by March 31 deadline who are enrolled in a public, private, parochial or home school program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools.
- Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent resident (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen.
- Foreign exchange students, students aged 15 or older are **not** eligible.
- Previous winners of VFW Auxiliary National Illustrating America Art Contests are **not** eligible for the same grade division of which they are a previous national winner. However, the students may enter the subsequent grade division.

Contest Rules

- Entry must be completed during the current school year.
- Entry must be two dimensional.
- Entry must be on canvas or paper.
- Canvas entries must be submitted on a stretcher frame or canvas board.
- Paper entries must be reinforced with heavy paper.
- Do **not** frame art with wood, metal, plastic or glass.
- Mats may be used, including mounted and floating mats.
- Entries may **not** be smaller than 8"x10" and **not** larger than 18"x24" **including** mat.
- Acrylic, chalk, crayon, ink, marker, pastel, pen, pencil, tempera, watercolor, glitter or other media may be used.
- If the American Flag is used, it does **not** need conform to the Federal Flag Code in relation to colors, numbers of stars and stripes and other pertinent rules of the code.
- Coloring sheets, digital art and photography are **not** accepted.
- Completed typed or printed legible entry form including parent and/or guardian signatures.
- Students' name, age and grade level must be printed on back of art entry.
