Each year at the State Convention, the special recognition of a dedicated Auxiliary member takes place who has serviced the organization for at least 25 consecutive years. It is the **Jeannette Frank Continuous Service Award**. Jeannette served as Department President in 1965-1966 and as National President in 1980-1981. Her dedication exemplified her dedication to the Veterans, the Auxiliary and the community .

The nomination process that takes place in the final quarter of the Program Year is simple. Any member in good standing may nominate another outstanding Auxiliary member who they feel is deserving of this recognition. Nominees must have served for a minimum of 25 consecutive years. (NOTE: **Past Department Presidents** are **NOT** eligible as they receive a separate Continuous Service Award.)

Nominations for the **2024-2025 Jeannette Frank Continuous Service Award** must be **postmarked** by **April 10, 2025**. Information & nomination forms will be available in the October 2024 and February 2025 Auxiliary mailings. It will also be on the Auxiliary State website and by request.
