

Did you know about Uniting for Veterans?

Originally established in 2018 as the Uniting to Combat Hunger program, the VFW and our friends at Humana® created Uniting for Veterans to actively address food insecurity across America with an emphasis on the military community. And we're not stopping there as we have now added a veteran homelessness component and will continue to do all we can to improve quality of life for America's heroes and their families. Uniting to Combat Hunger - VFW

Together with <u>Humana®</u>, the VFW's *Uniting for Veterans* program, formerly known as *Uniting to Combat Hunger & Homelessness*, was established to address the diverse and evolving needs of the military and veteran communities. From fighting food insecurity and homelessness, to providing resources to help improve quality of life for all service members and veterans, the Uniting for Veterans program is our united commitment to doing all we can for America's heroes and their families who have sacrificed so much for our country.

According to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), data shows that on a single night in January 2024, 32,882 veterans experienced homelessness in America — a record low in veteran homelessness since measurement began in 2009. The data also show a 7.5% decrease in Veteran homelessness since 2023, an 11.7% decrease since 2020, and a 55.6% decrease since 2010, but all of this comes comes at a time when overall homelessness in America is at an all-time high.

In 2025 alone, Uniting for Veterans raised more than 800,000 meals and 325 nights of housing for homeless veterans. To date, the VFW and Humana® have provided more than 6.4 million meals over the past eight years for food insecure families.



Pin placement when wearing uniform shirt (note flat on collar)

ATTENTION: When Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States Auxiliary are at Attention it means their hands are at their side, head up with eyes looking straight ahead.

HEART SALUTE: Members of the Auxiliary shall rise and salute the Flag by placing the palm of the right hand flat over the heart, or Military Salute (veterans) when the Flag passes by in parade. Below are examples when in uniform or dress casual attire:





PARADE REST: The left foot is moved slightly to the side while bringing the arms to the small of the back. Place the left thumb in the palm of the right hand. The head is bowed slightly during the prayer.






Words of Encouragement





Department of Wisconsin Hospital Chairmanship November 2025

Who Me? Do you think you could become a VA Representative for our Veterans? Here are the descriptions for the different Volunteers for the Hospitals and Nursing Homes.

Regularly Scheduled (RS) Volunteers: Regularly scheduled volunteers are VFW Auxiliary members who participate in the VAVS Program on a regularly scheduled assignment under VA supervision. Frequency of participation is determined by the local VA medical facility. They are officially authorized to serve when they have:

- A. Completed and signed the VFW Auxiliary's "VAVS Volunteer Forum"
- B. Been certified by the Auxiliary Certifying Official
- C. Been approved for assignment by the Voluntary Service Program Manager Designee
- D. Participated in required screenings, background checks, fingerprinting, Interviews, orientations and training required by the VA facility
- E. Completed a trial period as established by the VA facility

Occasional Volunteers: Occasional volunteers are individuals serving under the VAVS Program who do not meet the requirements of Regular Scheduled volunteers. These individuals frequently volunteer with a group or organization on an occasional basis.

Student Volunteer: Student volunteers are under the age of 18 and must have written parental or guardian approval to participate in the VAVS Program. They must also have Written authorization for diagnostic and emergency treatment if injured while volunteering. The minimum age for volunteers is determined by the facility management.

Sponsored Volunteers: Sponsored volunteers are non-members of the VFW Auxiliary who wish to serve under VFW Auxiliary sponsorship and supervision as volunteers at VA and non-VA facilities or in VA community-based programs. They must be interviewed and screeded in the same manner as VFW Auxiliary members. Upon acceptance, sponsored volunteers are governed by the same ethics and rules prescribed by members.

What does a Volunteer do? Assignments will vary depending on the needs of the facility per the Voluntary Service Program Manager. Some Traditional Assignments are Patient escort, volunteer driver (shuttles), clerical, information desk, guest relations, patient meal assistance and many more positions that have been open to our volunteers for years.

Non-traditional assignments are: Writing letters, respite/hospice volunteers, female-specific clinics requiring female volunteer assistance. Volunteering in outpatient clinics, rehabilitation and treatment centers and virtual volunteering with homebound veterans.

Won't you think about becoming a Volunteer???????

NOVEMBER 2025 - LEGISLATIVE

Here's **Congressional Bill** running through the halls of Congress, hoping to become a LAW. This is the path Bill must take to succeed:

- 1. Be proposed by a member of Congress.
- 2. Go before committee for discussion and revision.
- 3. Voted on by one chamber (House or Senate).
- 4. If passed, go to the other chamber.
- 5. If passed by 2nd chamber, go back to the 1st to be voted on again with any edits.
- 6. If both chambers vote to pass, go to the White House to see the president.
- 7. If the president signs, Bill becomes Law. If president vetoes (does not sign), then its back to Congress which can vote to override the veto, then Bill becomes Law.
- 8. If Congress does not override the veto, then Bill is finished.

Want to help Congressional Bill? Check Action Corp to see if Bill is VFW-supported. Send an email to your congressional representatives to urge them to support Bill.



Once Congressional Bill becomes a LAW, remember to **GIVE THANKS** to your representatives for their support of our veterans.


Send a follow-up email (or note) – your legislative chair can provide you with the text you can use.

- (Paramedic applicants only) include proof of program enrollment.
- Deadline: Applications must be postmarked by April 1, 2026.
- Winners announced: June 2026 at the Department of Wisconsin VFW Auxiliary Convention.



Essays for Patriot's Pen and Voice of Democracy are now in the hands of the District Chairmen. Let us now focus on Continuing Education. Our National Presidents special project is to raise funds for Continuing Education. Our President, Lois Callahan, would like us to do fundraisers to increase the amount of funds in the scholarship program to increase the amount available. To deposit money to the special project, select the "Make a Gift" tab and then "National President's 2025-2026 Special Project in MALTA." You could also mail a check to National Headquarters earmarked "National President's 2025-2026 Special Project."

Do you have a member or family member that is changing careers or want to further their education in some way? They may benefit from a little extra financial help. Put the info in your newsletters. Inform your members. Post it on your bulletin boards.

What? You don't know who is eligible or where to find the information?

Log on to www.vfwauxiliary.org/scholarships/continuing-education. Here you will get the application. The applicant must be 21 years old or older, a current VFW Auxiliary member, a spouse of a current VFW Auxiliary member, or a son or daughter of a current VFW Auxiliary member. The qualifying VFW Auxiliary member must have been a member of the VFW Auxiliary for one year by the application submission deadline of February 15th .

Four \$1,250.00 scholarships will be awarded each year, one in each of the four VFW Auxiliary Conferences. Each applicant must answer all questions on the Continuing Education application. They must also write a brief essay (no more than 300 words) describing their commitment to their goals and how this scholarship will help them attain these goals. The application process began on July 1st; the start of the new program year. All applications must be submitted to VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters by February 15, 2026. They may be emailed to info@vfwauxiliary.org or mailed to VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters 406 W. 34th Street 10th Floor Kansas City MO 64111 Attn: Program Awards Administrator. Scholarship recipients are notified by May 1, 2026.


RECOGNIZING YOUTH


Recognizing our youth for their achievements will encourage them to keep giving back to our veterans and community. Show our boys and girls that you see them by presenting:
