- 4Th Quarter Audits are also due no later than August 31, 2024. Remember, they need to be approved and dated at a regular Auxiliary Meeting.

A great first Council of Administration and School of Instruction was held at Stoney Creek Hotel in Onalaska, Wisconsin July 12-13. Congratulations! Everyone pulled together and brought in those last few members to end the 2023-2024 year at 100.4%! As we head into the new year, we face the same challenges we face every year, enlisting new members. As of 7/9/24, we are sitting at a place where, as a department, we need to recruit new or retain annual members at the rate of 4.7 members per day. If we are able to retain 80% of the annual membership from the prior year, this means that we will need to recruit, at a minimum, 216 NEW members.

Our National Membership Ambassador, Linda Roloff, and I are very much aligned with our messaging to our Auxiliaries – Keep Your “Why” Close By. As Linda states, “It has been said that in order to know where you are going, you must know where you’ve been”. We must remember who we are, why we do what we do, and what we stand for. As a member of the WI VFW Auxiliary you can enter the Members Only Section of our website. Bring up our website at: vfwauxwi.org When you look at the top line of tabs for various pages of the website, go to the far right side and click on "Log In". Under there you will see the dropdown menu and pick "Members Only". You can get in with your Membership number as the Username. Your default password is your last name with a capital first letter. Check it out!

The second big news!! "The 2024-2025 WI VFW Auxiliary Roster" is in the Members Only section! Now let me say it before you do – this looks a lot different than our past rosters. It is no longer the 114-page (57 sheets), 8.5" x 5.5" booklet. It is now just a 40-page 8.5 x 11" landscaped booklet (only 20 sheets-if printed back-to-back), if you want it on paper.

I have also broken-down the roster into separate sections on the page so that you can go straight to the section you want to find.

As you know, someone's information changes at least every month, if not everyday. I will be pulling new sections of the Roster and re-posting it once a week on the website. You can check the "Updated Date" on the bottom of the pages to know the last time it was updated.
