Can't Wait To See Your Pictures

Capturing the Best Pictures

When capturing your pictures, it's important to keep a few details in mind:

- Think about the format the picture is intended for (e.g.: Facebook, website, newspaper, etc.).
- Hold your hands steady; this will help keep your subject in focus.
- Never be afraid to take lots of pictures, as you never know what memories you'll most want to remember, or which picture will come out the best.
- Be aware of your timing when photographing (remember what kindness looks like).
- When taking photographs, connect with the subject and the emotion (don't be a paparazzi).

Remember to keep searching for STARS!

There is still plenty of time left to submit your legacy member interviews. You can email me the video file or link OR mail me a flash drive with the video saved on it, either way works for me. Just remember to also fill out and send me the National Historian Award form.

Let your Auxiliary legacy members become STARS, for without our STARS, our Auxiliary would not exist. Connect with a legacy member in your Auxiliary and complete a three- to five-minute video interview: Ask why they joined. Ask about their favorite memorable moment(s). Place emphasis on bringing the past to life. If your Auxiliary has no legacy members, look to your District or Department. Legislation to Watch Closely

H.R. 3722 Daniel J Harvery, Jr. and Adam Lambert Improving Servicemember Transition to reduce veteran suicide act and the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute

Veteran and service member suicide prevention is still the VFW's top priority. The risk is increases after transition from the military has been seen in recent research. When this was looked into more the risk is also heightened in individuals with mental health diagnoses. Education and support during transitioning service members with connections and resources outside of the military makes sure that the risk factors are identified and the proper care is given.

The VFW recommends and supports that Congress to ensure that the legislation provisions occur in a private setting for the sake of the veteran. This would give the veteran a safe and confidential environment to discuss any personal and or service related events.

Do you know what the VA Misson Act is? Is your veteran having issues with their care?

Va Misson Act was signed into law to aid in the care for veterans and opening up opportunities to provide them care inside or outside of the VA.

Veterans waited weeks or even months for their medical appointments at the Department of Veterans Affairs health facilities. While employees across the country would have hidden wait list to defer what was seen of the extended wait times. Some of the veterans on this list even died waiting to see a doctor.

It took four years for action to be taken to ensure veterans can get medical care in a timely manner. This became the VA MISSION ACT and became law. This gives veterans more choice over where they get their care from.
