- Have a sense of responsibility, dependability, and stability on the job.
- Demonstrate a friendly, business-like approach to volunteer work, with honest sentiment and non-sentimentality, maintaining the veteran's dignity and pride.

All assignments of volunteers will vary greatly depending on the needs of the facility and the program that the facility has developed. Supervision tries to place volunteers in situations which permit them to best utilize their vocational training, skills, interests, and physical capabilities.

Every facility will have its own set of qualifications and rules that members should fully understand and comply.
